Message from the Board

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Valentines greetings, Egret Landing residents! We have kicked off the year with new projects that will benefit our community and our safety here at Egret Landing.

Commencing this month is our newest project regarding surveillance cameras being installed, both at the guard house to capture incoming views of vehicles, as well as an additional camera that will be installed by the playground. The camera at the playground will give us a panoramic view of the playground and tennis courts. We have spent quite a bit of time researching systems that are best suited to our neighborhood as well as locations that will make the most of these devices. More information will follow in the upcoming months about installation.

The Town of Jupiter is also on site repairing sidewalks by grading them and adding new concrete in some instances. Our property manager and maintenance man walked the entire property and marked each trip hazard for the town to expedite their work. If you notice that we have missed an area, please contact the property manager promptly to add the area to the list.

In another effort to update, we are replacing 168 of our old wooden street signs with aluminum signs that are high intensity reflective with rounded corners on one side. The signs will be green with white letters, and the new reflective coating will brighten them up for easier reading.

We will also be removing fascia bricks that have come down on our front columns at the clubhouse. Over the years we have replaced these bricks but will now remove them, smooth the columns and repaint for easier maintenance. Along with the column renovation, we

are also at the point where the exterior of our clubhouse is due for painting, so the project will be done at the same time.

Pool pavers on the veranda facing the pool will also undergo a leveling, and damages from tree roots are being evaluated on the tennis courts. The courts are scheduled for an update, and we will research this project further to plan for updates when our tennis team is finished with their schedule and the courts are the least utilized.

Upcoming events include our Spring Celebration. This event includes an Easter egg hunt and is always a treat for the younger crowd at Egret Landing, so please watch for details in upcoming newsletters. I also want to remind everyone of the reduced rental rates for the clubhouse. With its new floors, tables and chairs and rugs it is a great place for birthday celebrations, baby showers and graduation parties so remember to book early because slots will go quickly.

The gym is sporting a new rowing machine that is state of the art and has replaced one of the elliptical machines. Our gym committee is doing a great job keeping us up to date on the latest devices so please stop by and check it out.

Finally, please remember that March is our election month, so make sure to cast your ballot and have your votes counted.

PROPERTY INSPECTIONS

Property inspections will start in February. If you receive a violation letter, please respond by correcting the issue in a timely manner.

As the Property Manager for Egret Landing, my goal is to assist the homeowners in maintaining the property value and aesthetic appearance of the community. To reach this goal, I am empowered by the homeowners through the Board of Directors to routinely inspect the property to ensure compliance with the neighborhood covenants.

Notices will be sent out for the following violations:

- Dirty or broken mailboxes
- Dirty roofs
- Need for exterior painting
- Vines growing on side/back of home
- Overgrown hedges, especially those over 10 feet or encroaching on sidewalks

If you cannot remedy a violation by the deadline noted in a violation letter, please contact the office at 561-575-7676 as soon as possible to discuss other possible remediation. The Board is willing to work with homeowners, *but you must contact the office to work out an extension.*

Plan to trim all trees lining the road or sidewalk in April after the cold weather passes. Weather considerations should also be made when replacing hedges or sod.

VOTING INSTRUCTION SHEET: For Your Vote To Count

It is imperative that you properly follow the instructions for voting in order to have your vote count in the Board of Directors election. Any error in the completion of the process may void your vote.

- If you are attending the annual election on Wednesday, March 7th at 6:00 PM at the clubhouse, please bring with you the yellow ballot in the **SEALED** yellow envelope.
- If you cannot attend the annual election, you will need to complete the **blue proxy** and place it in the **blue envelope** AND complete the **yellow ballot** and place it in the **yellow envelope**.
 - a. Return the enclosed “BLUE PROXY” AND “YELLOW” BALLOT sealed in their separate envelopes and placed into the larger “WHITE ENVELOPE.”
 - b. Either mail both to Bristol Management **or** hand deliver in the larger white envelope to the Association Clubhouse no later than March 7th.

Be advised that if you own more than one Lot, each Lot must have separate ballots and the ballots must be placed in separate envelopes. **Multiple ballots or proxies in a single envelope will void all ballots contained in the yellow envelope.**

Additionally, BOTH documents need to be completed the “Proxy and the Ballot” in order for there to be a **quorum present** at the annual meeting, **it is imperative** that you **Do not put the blue proxy in the yellow voting envelope.** **This proxy statement will be used for determining a quorum at the annual meeting.**

LOOSE ANIMALS

The property manager has received complaints about loose dogs and cats in the neighborhood.

Dogs and cats running loose in the neighborhood are exposed to many dangers every day, including, but not limited to:

- automobiles (the #1 killer of loose dogs and cats)
- becoming lost
- being stolen
- abuse by people
- fights with other animals
- diseases
- poisons (including antifreeze and rat-bait)
- extreme weather (winter and summer)
- lack of proper food and clean water
- injury or death from belts or rotating blades in car engines (cats often crawl under car hoods, dying when the car is started)



Whenever outside of the house or enclosed yard, your dog should always be on a leash. This way you can ensure that he or she is always under control. Even the best obedience-trained dogs can be frightened by sudden movements or loud noises, causing them to bolt.

Cats never need to go out of the house. They lead perfectly contented – and much longer – lives if they remain indoors at all times. If it is necessary to transport a cat, a secure animal carrier should always be used.

If a dog or cat accidentally slips out of the home, it is imperative that they are wearing the proper, up-to-date identification tags. Another form of identification you may consider is the microchip. In the event that a conscientious person finds your animal, you have a better chance of having your lost animal returned.

Town of Jupiter Municipal Code, Chapter 5 (Animals), Article II (Dogs and Cats), Sec. 5-46 (Running at large prohibited, *Code 1975, § 4-3*), states that dogs and cats must be leashed and attended when outside. The code also states that pet owners are responsible for picking up pet waste (Chapter 5, Article I, Sec. 5-10, *Code 1975, § 4-16*).

DYING EUGENIA BUSHES

Many Eugenia bushes in the neighborhood are dying due to damage from cold weather, and they need to be replaced. Please take a moment and look around your property to determine if your Eugenia bushes are dying. If so, please put a plan in place to replace those plants in the early spring. Be sure to submit an ARB request for the landscaping replacement.

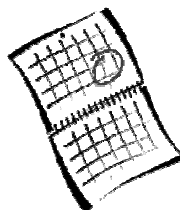
GARBAGE CANS

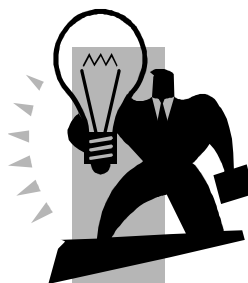

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BOARD (ARB)



The ARB is in charge of reviewing all exterior changes to properties in Egret Landing.

Examples of exterior changes include, but are not limited to, exterior paint for home or driveway, landscaping, hurricane shutters, pools and pool fences, yard fences, etc.

Twice per month, applications are reviewed at ARB meetings. Homeowners can drop off their applications at those meetings or at the clubhouse office. Check the newsletter calendar for meeting dates.

ARB forms are available in the Clubhouse office or online at www.bristolmanagement.com – just click on “Associations” then “Egret Landing” and look in the Forms section for the different forms available.

Per the Egret Landing Design Standards, **the ARB has 14 days to respond to an application.** The 14 days starts from the first ARB meeting after the design change form is dropped off for review. **PLEASE PLAN YOUR SUBMISSIONS ACCORDINGLY.**

TRIM YOUR TREES

It's not too early to start thinking about trimming your trees for the upcoming hurricane season. Be thinking about trimming your trees in April after the cold weather passes. Please take a moment to step outside your home and look at your property – ask yourself if your palms or other trees need pruning.

Hopefully this information will help better explain how to properly trim your trees or how to get assistance.

General Tree Pruning (from blogs.palmbeachpost.com/eyeonthestorm/before-the-storm/landscapes-your-trees-and-yard)

Call a professional. Trees trimmed by a **professional arborist** are far less likely to go down in a storm.

Thinning a tree allows wind to blow through its canopy, offering less wind resistance in a storm.

Hatracked trees become sails. Removing a tree's canopy encourages bushy growth, which makes a treetop heavy and wind-resistant.

Some hatracked trees "sail" directly to the ground. Hatracking is illegal.

'Lifted' trees mean broken branches. "Lifting" is a common practice where the lower branches are removed to provide clearance

underneath. Lifting contributes to branch breakage and makes the tree top heavy.

Don't wait until a storm is threatening to prune; if the trash pickup doesn't get to your curb before the storm strikes, you've created a pile of potential missiles.

Palm Tree Pruning (excerpt from sunpalm-trees.com/Palm-Tree-Care-Pruning.html)

Prune off yellow, brown or broken palm fronds.

Remove loose petioles (stalks) or boots (leafbases) by hand. If they don't pull off, leave them on.

Remove palm flower and fruit stalks. The formation of fruit and seed takes strength away from palm trees unnecessarily. When mature, fruits may provide food for pests, such as rodents and birds, or they can drop and make a mess or stain concrete surfaces.

Thin out palms if the trees are getting too big for the space in which they are growing. This is especially for clumping palms and includes new growth.

Remove fruits and seeds. Some palms produce seeds that germinate in the landscape or fruit that makes a mess and smells bad when it drops. Most palm trees do not produce either fronds or fruit large enough to cause damage when falling. Removing flowers or developing fruit can free up starch that benefits developing fronds, roots and storage reserves. **Coconuts behave like cannonballs in high winds.** Remove them well before a storm hits. If trees are too tall for you to reach, hire a tree trimmer.

To determine compliance, the property manager uses guidelines available on the internet.

If you do not have internet access, the Property Manager can provide you with a copy of these documents – just stop by the clubhouse.

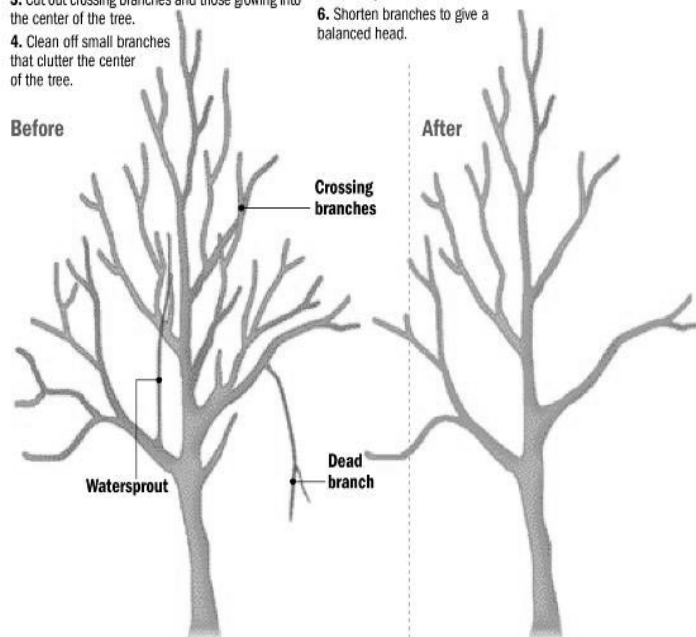
You may also consider hiring a certified arborist to do the job.

Please remember, it is each homeowner's responsibility to keep trees trimmed.

Tree pruning for storms

The order of pruning is always the same:

1. Cut out dead, diseased and damaged wood.
2. Take out watersprouts.
3. Cut out crossing branches and those growing into the center of the tree.
4. Clean off small branches that clutter the center of the tree.
5. Select a well spaced framework of branches and cut all others out completely.
6. Shorten branches to give a balanced head.
